As Par	t of the Bible, the Old Testament has
A.	all the words in Old Testament are God's words in such a way, that to disbelieve or disobey any word of Scripture is to disbelieve or disobey God.
B.	the Old Testament, in the original manuscripts, does not affirm anything that is contrary to fact.
C.	the Bible is written in such a way that its teachings are able to be understood by all 1) who will read it 2) seeking God's help and 3) being willing to obey whatever He commands in it.
D.	We need the Old Testament for rightly understanding the gospel and for spiritual growth, spiritual maintenance, spiritual multiplication.
E.	The Bible has and continues to contain all the words of God that He intended His people to have at each stage of redemptive history.

  - Over 10% of the NT is either a direct OT quote or allusion.

**Luke 24:44**, "These are the words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things must be fulfilled which were written in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms concerning Me."

**John 5:39,** "You search the Scriptures, for in them you think you have eternal life; and these are they which testify of Me."

- And the rest of the NT authors agree as well.

**Acts 3:18**, "But those things which God foretold by the mouth of all His prophets, that the Christ would suffer, He has thus fulfilled."

**I Corinthians 15:3-4**, "For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, **4** and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures"

**2 Timothy 3:15**, "the Holy Scriptures...are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus"
